I THESE do certify that the Gentleman *John Moore*
Serjeant having been ordered by the Commissioners of
Chelsea Hospital to the Regiment of Invalids commanded by
Lord Lindores the *10th* Day of *Jan^y* 1762 after
being discharged for *Twenty* Years Service in the *12th*
Regiment of *Foot* then commanded by *Genl. Sayer*
Hath served honestly and faithfully in the above
Regiment for the Space of *above one Year*: But in Obe-
dience to His Majesty's Order of Reduction, bearing Date
the *25th* Day of *May* 1763

He is hereby discharged the said Regiment, and recom-
mended as a proper Object to partake of His Majesty's Royal
Bounty of *Chelsea Hospital*: Having received all just De-
mands of Cloathing and Pay from his Entry to the said Com-
pany to the *24th* Day of *June 1763* inclusive,
as appears by the subjoined Receipt.
